
Out of 190,000 citywide arrests in 2022, ~9,000 people came into NYC courts with one of the following situations:

- Felony rearrest with an already pending Felony case in court
- Multiple recent warrants (2+ in the last 5 years)
- Several pending cases (3+)

Of this 8% of arrested people, ~2,000 went on to have a new violent felony arrest pretrial.

This group is a significant contributor to overall citywide arrests.

People with a Recent Persistent Pattern as a % of Total 2022 Citywide Arrests



Focusing on Prevention & Precision Intervention

In working towards a city where **every person** receives the **best available effective services** to prevent violence and crime, different programs are effective at different stages.



PREVENTING JUSTICE INVOLVEMENT

Entire population For example: an entire population of school children receiving a program with wide-ranging benefits.

Multi-system involved families with elevated need and/or risk. Comprehensive, therapeutic, supportive interventions based on a range of agency indicators.

RESPONDING TO JUSTICE INVOLVEMENT

Early stages of criminal justice system involvement, light touch supportive programming matched to needs.

Small group of people with highest involvement in violence and crime receive intensive therapeutic programs with large (30-60%) immediate (6-18 month) reductions in violence.
